


Perineum

Which means around urethra , anal canal

(Pubic bone) symphysis pubis





obturator


transverse

→ transverse perineal muscle (deep)




another view : ♂



rupture in membranous urethra → urine stays @ deep pouch (not superficial pouch)

rupture in penile urethra → urine stays @ penis / scrotum / abdominal wall

(not to thigh because of fascia lata
not to deep fascia because of perineal membrane)



Quick summary for arterial supply:

Internal iliac artery



Internal pudendal artery



In the pudendal canal

- ① inferior rectal A.
- ② perineal A. → scrotal / labial

Transverse

- 1 In the deep perineal pouch
- 2 In the superficial pouch



→ artery of bulb
