

Question 1:

A patient came to your colleague, not symptomatic; a blood test with CBC and other tests was provided; the fasting blood glucose was 130.

- What is the next step?

Ans: Repeat the test HbA1C or FBG or OGTT or random blood sugar (we were required to write the name of the test that must be repeated).

- What is the diagnosis?

Ans: Megaloblastic anemia.

- What is the most common cause for a vegetarian patient?

Ans: Vit B12 Deficiency.

Question 3:

A 44 y/o patient complains of fatigue; no recent medication use; his blood test appears normal. In 1988, he had a motorcycle accident that required a blood transfusion, and in his twenties, he had some recreational drug use. His liver function test was provided with significantly high AST and ALT.

- What is the next step?

Ans: Test for anti-HCV antibody (not sure).

A 73 y/o patient came with new-onset low back pain, unintentional weight loss and urinary incontinence (as far as I remember).

- What is the most common dangerous cause?

Ans: Cancer metastasis.

Question 5:

A doctor complains of persistent frustration towards a particular patient.

- What is the name of this phenomenon?

Ans: Countertransference.

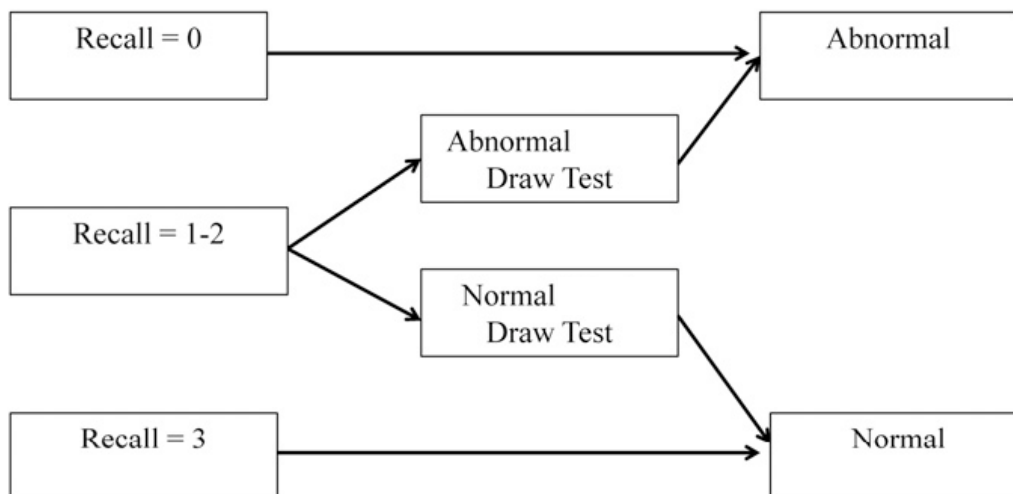
Question 6:
